This Week's Topic:

River Walk Improvement Project

The Las Vegas River Walk south of Bridge Street has just undergone some unique improvements designed to help in wetland restoration, habitat diversity and to help with the hydro-ecological function of the river. The demands of water use and environmental protection is a complex challenge. Concerns about sustainable water use, water management and wetland protection cause increased pressure on municipalities and it's customers to balance these demands. This project is a collaboration with the (HPWA) Hermit's Peak Watershed Alliance, Watershed Artisans, Inc. and the City of Las Vegas. The purpose is to make a positive impact to the river by restoring natural functions and helping to create a sustainable environment for people and the natural ecosystem.

Did You Know?
