This Week's Topic:

United World College Sewer Extension

In January 2016, the United World College (UWC) expressed interest in connecting to the City of Las Vegas sanitary sewer system. Based on the configuration of the existing City sanitary sewer facilities in the vicinity of the UWC, the cost effective alternatives that are available to extend the sewer system to the UWC are very limited. There is no existing sewer system at or near the UWC. A meeting between the City and UWC was held to discuss the scope of work and the possible alternatives. The conclusion of the meeting was the UWC will fund and construct new sewer lines from UWC to Cinder Road. Ground breaking on this project has begun on June 8, 2017 and will be completed by July 31, 2017. Please use extreme caution and expect delays from Cinder Road to Camino Road.
