This Week's Topic:

Project Complexity

The City is making progress on all areas of the Water Enhancement Program (WEP). The basis for the WEP are the projects identified in the City's overall Preliminary Engineering Report (PER). It's a complex juggling act. For each of many projects, the necessary ingredients have to be brought together at the right time to allow construction to proceed. The ingredients include the detailed engineering design specifications, the bid documents, permits from the state (and sometimes federal) agencies, enough money from grants, loans and the City water funds, and numerous cycles of approval by the City Council. And many of these ingredients come with tightly limited time frames.
