
Nature of Job: This is a specialized position to develop watershed restoration/revitalization design efforts, to promote the stewardship of the watershed resources of the City of Las Vegas by coordinating watershed projects. The Watershed Specialist is responsible for providing technical, informational, and organizational assistance that will improve watershed development and the quality and quantity of the City's surface water resources. Assisting in the development and use of resource inventories, land use information, and available water quality assessments to identify existing and potential sources of non-point source pollution (NPS). Working with watershed groups to do any additional NPS problem assessment necessary to develop and implement a watershed management plan. Providing technical assistance in the planning and implementation of structural and nonstructural best management practices designed to restore and protect surface water quality. Performs additional duties related to the scope of duties required. (A detailed job description is available at the Human Resource Office.)


Qualifications: Valid New Mexico drivers license with good driving record. Must be insurable by City's insurance carrier. Required to drive automobiles, pickups, service vehicles for field work and travel purposes. A Bachelor's Degree in environmental resources management, or a related field such as environmental science, geology, soil science or agronomy or any equivalent combination of training and work experience that provides equivalent knowledge, skills and abilities that are necessary to perform the duties listed in this job description. At least 6 months work experience in watershed management, coordinating stream programs and land use planning.
