City Utility completed and in construction projects

City Utilities Department recently completed the following projects: *North Gonzales Waterline Replacement from San Miguel to N Delgado; W National Meter Replacement; Hanna Park effluent water line extension; Lift Station Replacements at NMDOT, Dee Bibb and Detention Center; Pump & VFD Installation at Storrie Pump House; Hot Springs Sewer line replacement from Bernalillo to San Miguel*

City Utilities Department has the following projects in construction: *Hot Springs Water line replacement from Bernalillo to Mills; Independence Sewer line replacement from S Pacific to the River Bridge; Baca Water Line Replacement from 3rd to 6th; Parkview Water Line Replacement; Water Treatment Plant Filter Media changeout; Kemm Dr Sewer line replacement.*
