PUBLIC INPUT

PRESENTATION

Deputy Finance Director Tana Vega presented the Housing Financial report for October 31, 2015. It represents 33% of the year lapsed. Dwelling rents are at 45%. Operating subsidy is at 28%. Housing, other income is at 25%, and transfers in are at 67% for a net result of 40% in net revenues. Deputy Finance Director Vega stated that the expenditures, employee expenses, is at 34% of budget, and operating expenses, 24%. A net of 29% expended at October 31st.

Commissioner Gurule-Giron asked Deputy Finance Director Vega about the transfers of CPF Funds and to explain the 67%. Deputy Finance Director Vega explained that 100% of the Homeownership transfer was already recorded in the books. Being that it was cash on hand in the Homeownership fund which was transferred into the low rent. Commissioner Gurule-Giron asked her to explain the 67% of the 100%. Deputy Finance Director Vega stated there is also an additional amount budgeted for one of the capital funds. Commissioner Gurule-Giron stated under other income it includes interest, late fees, charges, and unit repair. Commissioner Gurule-Giron asked if she could itemize the interest. How much is that was interest and where did that come from. Deputy Finance Director Vega stated that the checking account incurs interest on a monthly basis. Additionally there is a NOW account which is like a savings account which also incurs monthly interest. Housing Director Marrujo offered to provide a break down at next months meeting showing specifically what portion is interest, what portion are late fee charges, and what portion is maintenance charges. Commissioner Gurule-Giron stated that her question is, if they are federal dollars, she does not believe they are supposed to put them into an interest bearing account. Deputy Finance Director Vega stated that we can because the dwelling rent is not considered Federal dollars because that is local income. Commissioner Gurule-Giron said thank you for explaining that then asked for an explanation on the late fee charges. Director Marrujo explained that if tenants pay after the 5th day of the month they are charged a \$5.00 late fee. Commissioner Gurule-Giron asked what is done with those funds that come in once they are in the actual budget. Director Marrujo explained they go back into the operating budget. Those are also considered local funds.

HOUSING DIRECTORS MONTHLY REPORT

Housing Director Marrujo stated that last month she discussed the De minimus project. She stated the HA is currently scheduling the Resident Advisory Board (RAB) and Public Input

Meetings. She stated at the next meeting she will provide dates to the commission as to when those meetings will take place. Director Marrujo also provided to the commission with a "Lead the Way" reference with the roles and responsibilities of the Board of Commissioners for their information.

BUSINESS ITEMS

Approval/Disapproval of Out of State Travel for Natasha Martinez-Padilla, Housing Financial Specialist for the Capital Fund Guidebook Training in Huston, Texas.

Housing Director Marrujo explained that HUD is sponsoring this training, providing a Comprehensive Capital Fund Guidebook Training in Huston, Texas on December 8th and 9th. The training will be teaching the PHA's to understand the requirements contained under the recent Public Housing Capital Fund Program Final Rule. The estimated cost of the training was included in the packet for the Commissioners information. Also provided was the information on what the training will entail. This will be paid out of the Capital Fund Budget, Management Improvements.

Commissioner Joey Herrera made a motion to approve Out of State Travel for Natasha-Martinez-Padilla, Housing Financial Specialist for the Capital Fund Guidebook Training in Huston, Texas. Commissioner Tonita Gurule-Giron seconded the motion.
